Three-season sleeping bag with EraLoft™ hollow-fiber insulation, warm enough yet lightweight, suitable for demanding conditions and long journeys. The mummy shape provides both thermal and spatial comfort (enough room to turn). The sleeping bag has removable stretch straps to attach it to a sleeping pad, preventing it from slipping off. The straps are designed for pads up to 63 cm wide. Insulation – high-quality hollow polyester fiber EraLoft™. Inner lining with ThermoCapture layer that traps and retains radiant heat inside the bag. Outer material – lightweight and durable 20D Polyester Ripstop with water-resistant DWR finish. Mummy shape perfectly follows the human body. Anatomically shaped hood with drawcord prevents heat loss + inner draft collar around shoulders. Box-baffle construction, no cold spots, enlarged footbox. Inner draft tube along the zipper + two-way zipper with double sliders. Hanging loops (for storage and drying) + compression sack and storage sack included. External small zippered pocket.

Care instructions for EraLoft™ sleeping bags

Washing:

Hand wash or machine wash only in a large-capacity washing machine. Use mild soap without chemical additives. Wash in cold water, rinse twice. Do not bleach. Do not iron.

Drying:

Always dry the sleeping bag whenever possible. Proper drying is a long process and may take 24–48 hours, but along with regular cleaning, it is the best way to maintain the desired properties and extend the sleeping bag's lifespan. Dry only in a well-ventilated area with low humidity. Fully unroll the bag and turn it regularly to speed up drying.

If fast drying is required, use a large-capacity tumble dryer on low heat. The sleeping bag will loft up during drying, so always check that it rotates properly in the dryer to avoid scorching.

Storage:

The less compressed the sleeping bag is during storage, the longer it will provide reliable comfort. Store in a cool, dry place. If it must be stored in a sack, use the large storage bag provided, or another large breathable fabric bag.

Never use waterproof stuff sacks for storage!

Explanation of temperature ranges

Comfort Range:

Temperature at which a “standard woman” feels completely comfortable, relaxed, and does not feel cold.

Transition Range:

Temperature at which a “standard person” may feel the first signs of chill, but thermal balance is still maintained, and the person does not shiver. This is the important value when choosing a sleeping bag. It represents the bag's limit temperature, and below this the sleeper will start to feel cold.

Extreme Range:

Temperature at which health risks occur. There is a danger of hypothermia and a strong sensation of cold. At this temperature (and below), the sleeping bag should only be used in emergencies.

Always consider the actual condition of the sleeping bag (moisture, time since last washing and treatment), which may affect the indicated temperatures!
